

Pronouns and the Verb "To Be"

The #verb "to be" requires the same type of #pronoun (subject or object) before it and after it. (Example: I am taller than she. – "I" is a subject pronoun, "is" is the verb "to be", therefore, the pronoun that follows "is" must be a subject pronoun.)

- #Object pronouns (me, you, it, him, her) refer to the receiver of an action. (Example: She spoke to him.)
- #Subject pronouns (I, you, he, she, it) refer to the person doing an action. (Example: I play Scrabble.)
